A number of challenges emerged in the discussion, such as: better knowledge of marine environment, new 'circular' business models, stronger data-sharing and uptake of innovation potentials offered by digitalisation.



An increasing appetite for private investments in a sustainable blue economy across the Black Sea remains therefore unmatched, due to limited expertise of SMEs to pitch **financing institutions** with innovation projects.



The pivotal role of maritime clusters was acknowledged, notably for the uptake of innovative and sustainable **solutions** towards a sustainable blue economy.
